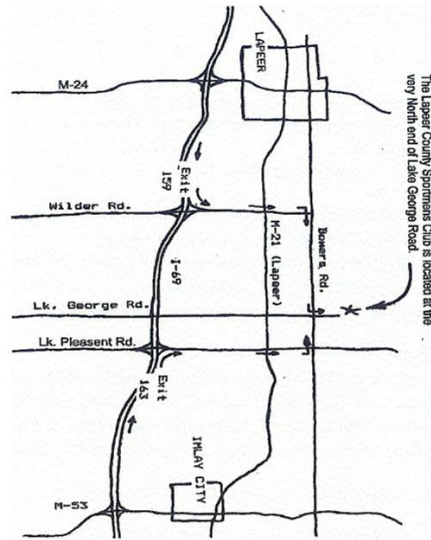


Fees & Prizes

- Camp fee: \$20 per family camp includes one shooter. Additional shooters are \$5 each, Junior Shooter \$3.
- Non-camper shooting fee: \$10 per person per day.
- Traders and suttlers pay no "traders' fee," and no camp fee unless they participate in competitions.
- Blanket prizes are encouraged, but not required, for all shooting matches. Bring your blanket prize when you register for each event. All blanket prizes are to have a minimum value of \$10 and be related to the 1740 - 1840 time period. *We will not accept items that are blaze orange or camouflage, made of plastic or rubber, pyrodex, cast iron pans, lead of any sort, bore cleaners, brushes or browning solutions. We reserve the right to return a blanket prize that is deemed unsuitable. If you put down a blanket prize and are unable to be present for the awards ceremony, you may designate someone to pick one for you. You must, however, be present to pick up a club or donated prize.*
- Prizes will be awarded for: Rifle (Men, Women, Junior), Trade Gun, Pistol, Hawk, Knife, Fire Starting, Archery.
- Top Aggregate will consist of: Rifle, Trade Gun, Fire Starting, Knife, and Hawk scores.

Camps

No Camps before Thursday

A camp is defined as one lodge and it's occupants. Multiple lodges are multiple camps unless occupied by minor(s) directly related to a registered main camp.

ψ All camps must register and display the camp registration tag.

- Modern camping in designated area only – Limited electrical sites available.
- The primitive area is pre-1840. Please, keep non-primitive items out of sight.
- Beginning Friday at 3 p.m., there is a 1½ hour time limit to unload your vehicle.
- No vehicles allowed in camp before 2 p.m. on Sunday. An early departure area will be designated.
- Water and firewood will be available.
- No loaded firearms in the camp area, including canons.
- All animals, drunk skinkers, and unruly children are to be suitably restrained.
- Please return all unused firewood to the main pile and fill in your fire pit before you leave.
- Quiet time: Midnight
- There will be Dog Soldiers patrolling the encampment. Their primary function is camp safety and preservation of the primitive atmosphere. Please cooperate with them.

Range Rules

ALL DECISIONS OF THE RANGE OFFICERS ARE FINAL

- Traditional style firearms or inline actions with open sights and patched round ball only. No hoods, shades, or peeps ATTACHED to the firearm permitted.
- All matches will be loaded from the pocket or pouch. No loading directly from powder horn, flask, or can.
- Patched round ball only, no polypatches, mini- or maxi-balls.
- Three falls of the hammer will count as a shot unless otherwise indicated.
- Discharge of the firearm will count as a shot.
- Juniors (17 or under) must be accompanied by a non-shooting parent or guardian on the shooting range who is familiar with the firearm being used. Exception – 12 thru 17 yrs of age with Hunter Safety certificate may be accompanied by participating adult.
- No sharing of a firearm during a relay.
- No starts after posted times, except for Score-Keepers and Range Officers if necessary.
- NO SMOKING or ALCOHOL in the shooting area.
